

HPV Vaccination Project ECHO - Free Medical Clinic

The American Cancer Society has launched a state-wide campaign entitled: HPV Cancer Free Texas with a goal to increase vaccine uptake and completion rates in the state of Texas to 80 percent by 2026. This campaign consists of equipping hospital systems, federally qualified health centers, private providers, nurses and more with tools and resources to help increase uptake of the HPV vaccine.

We understand the ongoing coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has created unprecedented challenges for healthcare providers, patients, and policymakers. One outcome from the past few months is dramatic declines in vaccination. A recent study showed that during this time a 71% drop in healthcare visits for 7-17-year-olds occurred, ages when critical vaccines like Tdap, HPV, and meningitis are given. These declines put children and communities at greater risk for outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases.

HPV Vaccination Project ECHO launch date: Thursday, July 16th, 2020 (12 PM – 1 PM CST)

This ECHO is a quality improvement project consisting of 7 monthly sessions lasting 1 hour. Our goal is to help clinics, private providers, nurses, medical assistants and more, to help with issues such as getting parents and patients back into the office post COVID, implementing evidence-based interventions, effectively communicating about the HPV vaccine, and team engagement.
