COURSE DESCRIPTION This summit is designed to encourage a national conversation on current challenges and future solutions by involving a national group of stakeholders in exploring the current state of the access pathway for under-represented students in medical education. - Prepare "proceedings" of the conference for broad distribution and engagement of customers, stakeholders, learners, and others
